













Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

When it's implemented well, **students achieve** improved social and academic outcomes, schools experience reduced exclusionary discipline practices, and school personnel feel more effective.



Special Education

- Create a collaborative learning community that promotes the development of each learner's unique potential in an encouraging and respectful environment.
- A wide range of service delivery models are offered including home-based services for infants and toddlers and school-based services within the school district.

Food Services

- Committed to providing healthy meals for all our students

Social Workers

- Assist parents who are new to the United States or who are not fully proficient in English to enroll students, meet school staff, understand grading systems school.

Transportation

- Elementary students in grades K-5 who live 0.5 miles or more from their assigned school are eligible for transportation.
- Routes for all grades are available for viewing on the Parent Portal through Infinite Campus two weeks prior to school starting.
- Student kinder backpack IDs and staff support during drop-off/dismissal







River Valley YMCA Before/After Care

- Partner with the River Valley YMCA (YMCA) in providing high quality care to students in grades K-5, five days a week onsite at each elementary school.
- Before School Care: 6:15 a.m. School Start
- After School Care: School End 6:15 p.m.
- School release day care and full day care is also offered.













Community Ed & Youth Associations

- Available to all district families with many programs and classes offered at our elementary schools.
- Catalog of classes and activities is mailed to every district household three times each year.
- Aligned with Shakopee's Academic Design Team and the "Six C's" initiative for curriculum development and direction.

Early Childhood Screenings

- Trained professionals determine if a child's development is on track:
 - Language
 - Motor skills
 - Problem-solving skills
- Information is gathered on child's social and emotional development as well as health history
- Vision and hearing checked by school nurse

- Required prior to starting Kindergarten (can start as early as 3)
- Free and held at Pearson Early Learning Center
- Available throughout the year on weekdays
- Interpreters are available



Social & Emotional Development Goal Checklist

/ Self-care

- Independently getting dressed and putting on shoes/boots
- Responsible for own belongings
- Use bathroom independently

√ Making friends

- Using appropriate words to solve problems
- Sharing and being polite when playing
- Knowing what it feels like to have feelings hurt and usually not wanting to hurt others

/ Persistence

- Not giving up, even when challenged
- Usually finishing projects
- Showing signs of focus and ignoring distractions when mind is set on a task

✓ Asking for help & following rules

- Follow multi-step instructions and ask for help when needed
- Knowing there are rules at home and at school
- Asking permission before doing something
- Ask for help
- Staying with the group
