

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

All ECFE Classes include:

Parent-Child Time



This special block of time is set aside during class so you can focus on your child's development and relationship. The environment is designed to provide developmentally-appropriate activities for you and your child to enjoy.

Three types of ECFE classes are available to families.

Non-Separating Classes

Parents and children stay together in the classroom for the entire length of the class. A licensed parent educator leads discussion within the child's classroom.

Gradual-Separating Classes

Parents will gradually work toward parent sessions in a parent education room.

Separating Classes

Following parent/child interaction time, parents meet in a separate classroom with a licensed parent educator for parent discussion.

ECFE's goal is to support and strengthen families. The parent educator works with the parents to create discussions that fit the needs of the group. Classes for parents & children one to four years

The classroom activities have been designed to enhance the child's natural curiosity about the world and give them tools to be successful. The curriculum is rich in literacy, math, science, social and emotional development and creative arts. Registration is required for both.*

About the Program

READY! for Kindergarten provides workshops and take-home materials and tools, to inspire and empower parents and caregivers to help babies and young children develop strong brain connections that determine how they will think, learn and grow.

Parents and caregivers attend a series of workshops each year, based on their child’s age. They learn new skills and helpful tips to nurture development in ways that foster academic skills and personal behaviors to boost children’s motivation, perseverance and engagement in learning.

The READY! for Kindergarten program provides targets (age-level learning goals), training (ways to “play with a purpose”), and tools (take-home materials and toys) to make learning at home fun, easy and effective. *Childcare for children six weeks through four years of age is available. Registration is required for the class and childcare.*




I Like Myself


The Crayon Box Talked

Selecting Classes

NEW!!!! To ensure that state identification numbers are correctly assigned to children enrolled in ECFE classes, we ask that you bring a photo-copy of your child's birth certificate to your first class.

- Choose a class based on your child's exact age as of September 1, 2018, *unless otherwise specified*.
- Classes are designed to be developmentally-appropriate. Choosing an incorrect aged class may result in your child not getting into a class and missed opportunities.
- Payment is required at time of registration.
- Families registering for a 28 week class will make two payments. First on the date of registration, second on February 1, 2019.

Registrations are first-come, first-served and begin December 17th.

When Parents Know, Children Grow

Some babies and young children need extra help to learn and grow. While all young children grow and change at their own rate, some children experience delays in their development. Special health conditions may affect children's development, too. Accessing early intervention services as early as possible will ensure the best developmental outcomes for these children.

Help Me Grow: Infant and Toddler Intervention are special services and support for families with children ages birth through two who have developmental delay(s) or certain diagnosed physical or mental conditions or disorders that may result in a delay.

Help Me Grow: Preschool Special Education is for children ages three to five years who meet state eligibility criteria for developmental delay(s) or other disability and who are experiencing challenges in their learning and development.

After a referral is made to Help Me Grow, local school district early intervention or preschool special education staff will contact the family to determine whether a comprehensive screening or evaluation is needed to determine eligibility.

There are three simple steps to refer a child online:

1. Visit HelpMeGrowMN.org.
2. Click "Refer a Child" button.
3. Fill out form and click "Send this Referral."

To refer a child by phone, call 866.693.GROW (4769).

- The PACE (Parent, Adult, Child, Education) Family Literacy Program is a unique opportunity that combines:
 - Adult Basic English language learning.
 - Parent education and support.
 - Early Education for children birth through four years of age.
 - Parent and child interaction.
- Transportation may be provided for families who do not have any transportation. *Space is limited.*
- Lunch is provided for children.
- All families need to qualify for this program based on the following admission requirements:
 - Parent qualifies for beginning English language education.
 - Children are birth through age four and qualify because their primary language is not English.
 - Family qualifies for free and/or reduced school lunch program.

Introduce your child to STEM...

All children are born with a natural sense of wonder and endless excitement for learning how things work. This is evident when a baby drops their spoon from a high chair over and over or when a toddler explores a newly frozen puddle. Early exposure to STEM in a child's natural environment supports children's overall academic growth, develops early critical thinking and reasoning skills. As parents, you can support your child's sense of curiosity.

Try these activities with your toddler and preschooler at home...

Create ramps and send down all sorts of things that go! You can also introduce things that don't roll and see what happens! Grab some cardboard and toy cars, balls, and blocks.

Build, build, and build some more! Super high towers, houses, whatever your toddler is building with their blocks is expanding his design process and his engineering skills. Provide tons of cool blocks and read books with kids building neat things!

Mirror play, light, and reflection are always fun with a toddler. Set out a shatterproof mirror (supervised) and let them add small toys to it or even build with small foam blocks.

Show him or her their shadow, do shadow dances, or make shadow puppets on the wall. You can even set up stuffed animals to see their shadows too. Flashlights are always great fun.

Water play is wonderful for kids to explore some fun STEM ideas. Pick a variety of objects to test out sink or float. Or try adding a toy boat and filling it with rocks to make it sink. Have you ever added a sponge to a water bin? Let them explore water absorption! Simply filling and dumping a variety of shaped cups introduces volume and weight and measurements.

Blowing bubbles is a childhood must, but it's also science too! Make sure to blow bubbles with your kids, chase them, look at the colors. All of these simple activities set you up for more cool science later on.

The playground is an amazing place to explore gravity, different forces, and acceleration all through play. A jungle gym or playground is the perfect place to use physics in a playful way. Toddlers will simply love going up and down and sliding and hanging. As they get older and older you can actually introduce physics into the play.

Of course nature is a huge area of science and STEM for a toddler to explore. Get outside and find new discoveries everyday. Look for budding flowers or plant your own and check on their growth. Go on a bug hunt or play in the dirt and discover worms. Chase butterflies, measure rainfall, watch the leaves change color, catch snowflakes. Lie on your backs and talk about the clouds in the sky or feel the grass below you. My favorite science tool for any kid is a kid friendly magnifying glass!

Lastly, introduce and explore the 5 senses with your toddler. The 5 senses are unique to each of us and it's fun to watch young kids explore these. The 5 senses include taste, touch, sound, smell, and sight. Encourage feeling new textures, listening for birds, tasting a new fruit (and examine the seeds!), smelling the flowers, or watching the rain fall.

Take time to support your child to be a Scientist, Engineer, Techie and Mathematician through their natural curiosity!

Stepping Stones Preschool Scholarships

Stepping Stones Preschool Early Learning Scholarships

Scholarships are available for families that qualify based on state guidelines. Below you'll find some frequently asked questions about scholarships.

How do scholarships work?

There are two scholarships that families can apply for, one with funds coming from the state and the other state funds that are issued by our school. Here's a quick breakdown of the two scholarships.

State Scholarship	School Scholarship
Students who qualify will receive \$7500 which can be used for preschool and extended care tuition.	Students who qualify will receive tuition assistance for a 2, 3 or 5 half day preschool program. School scholarships cannot be used toward extended care tuition.
State scholarships are awarded in July on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications can be submitted now.	School scholarships are available immediately on a first-come, first-served basis.

Who can apply for a scholarship?

To be eligible for an Early Learning scholarship, families must live in Scott County and have a child who is 3 or 4 years old by September 1 of the current school year and not yet eligible for kindergarten. A family must have an annual income at or below the income guidelines in the chart below to apply for a scholarship.

Please contact 952-496-5054 for specific information on how to apply for an Early Learning scholarships. *Families that are over the income guideline but are experiencing a family hardship can contact our offices for scholarship consideration. Apply early.*


