INTERNSHIP GOALS

After completing an internship, student should be able to:

- Apply knowledge to real-world problems in a realworld work experience setting.
- Develop sound decision-making skills through the professional-based work experience.
- Describe and demonstrate appropriate professional conduct in a work environment.
- Develop a professional vision that values diversity in the workplace.

THE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

- > Students will work at the internship sites four days a week from 8:20 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. (January 27 March 20, 2020)
- Students will collaborate with professionals to develop skills needed while working on real-world projects.
- > Student internships are unpaid during school hours.
- > Students will apply and interview to be offered an internship.
