## Melted Recycled Crayon Art

### Supplies:

1. Canvas
2. Crayons
3. Strong craft glue (E6000 is a good brand)
4. Blow dryer

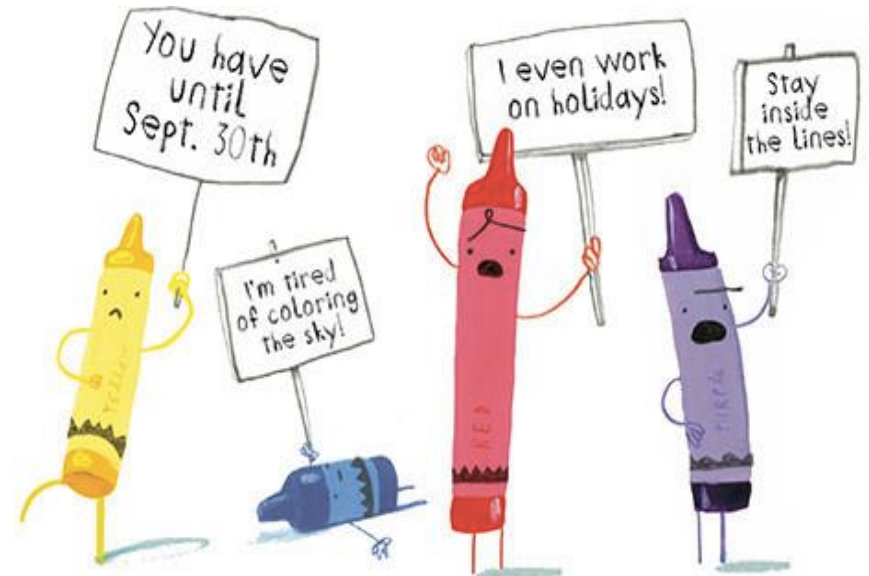
### Directions:

1. Break up broken crayons into smaller sizes so they are easier to melt.
  2. Have your kid line up how they want their crayon pieces to appear on the canvas-shapes are fun, too!
  3. Glue the crayon pieces once the crayons are laid out on the canvas. Make sure the glue is dried before you attempt to apply heat to melt the crayons.
  4. Blowdry, blowdry, blowdry!
- \*\*It takes a while the crayons to melt but once they get going the effect is super cool!
