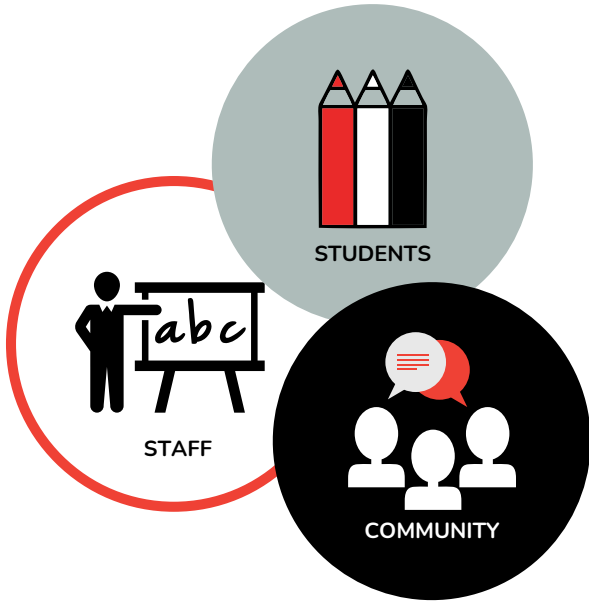

Support our students and sustain in-person learning

- Scott County COVID-19 cases per 10,000 has increased since October 26
- Week of November 1: Most COVID-19 cases in our district in any week since beginning of pandemic
- Week of November 8: More COVID-19 cases in our district than previous week
- Current Week: Increasing COVID-19 case trends continuing

STEP ONE

Extended time out during the Thanksgiving break (9 days) provides for longer separation, and less virus spread.

POSSIBLE STEP TWO

Excludes Shakopee Online, Pearson Early Learning Center and Tokata Learning Center

GOAL: Make proactive changes to our student schedules & district operations to continue with a large amount of in person learning, rather than potentially being forced by staffing shortages to move groups of students on very short notice to distance learning for extended periods of time.

- Schools operating in-person 4 out of every 5 days with rolling off-days by site; rotation schedule provided upon transition to step two
- Potential dates to shift to 4-day school week:
 - Week of November 29; communication to be sent November 23
 - Week of December 6; communication to be sent December 1
 - Week of December 13; communication to be sent December 8
- Expected return to normal school district operations and schedules on January 3, 2022.
