

Unusual Past Tense Words

Add -ed to some words to make past tense.

```
jump + ed = jumped (Today I jump, but yesterday I jumped.)
smile - e + ed = smiled (Today I smile, but yesterday I smiled.)
```

Other words change their spellings to make past tense. In some words, vowel letters and sounds change.

```
freeze —> froze (Today I freeze, but yesterday I froze.)
tell —> told (Today I tell, but yesterday I told.)
```

In other words, the vowel stays the same but changes from long to short.

```
feed —> fed (Today I feed the horses, but yesterday I fed the horses.)
sweep —> swept (Today I sweep, but yesterday I swept.)
```
