WINTER TRAVEL 4TH-8TH GRADE

The Shakopee Boys Basketball Association provides opportunities for youth in grade four to eight to participate in travel basketball. We do allow third-grade players to try-out for fourth grade travel. Players must live or be open enrolled in the Shakopee School District to register.

Traveling basketball is a competitive basketball program. Four travel teams per grade level will be formed, if enough players register. Game participation will be at the discretion of the coaching staff. Teams will participate in approximately two to three weekend tournaments per month from November through March, including the state tournament. Practices will be held twice a week at various school locations. Game uniforms will be provided but remain the property of the Shakopee Boys Basketball Association. Parents are responsible for all transportation.

Travel Team Evaluations

Participants should attend both evaluations sessions. Team selection is based on skill level. If your player does not make a team, a \$100 refund will be returned to you. Players are required to attend both evaluations.

How to Donate

Online donations go to: <http://pledgestar.com/sunpath>. Enter your name and email address, then click **Register**, then just follow the instructions on screen. When you finish, the system emails pledge requests to family and friends, and allows them to make secure credit card donations online. You will be notified every time a pledge is made and you can track your progress online. *You can also find the link on Sun Path's PTO website/ Facebook page.*

Donations can also be made in cash or check (made out to Sun Path PTO) and brought to school in your child's donation envelope on or before October 11th. We will be collecting the envelopes and calculating the total amount raised on that day.

What does your fundraising money pay for?

Our PTO funds many events and activities through out the year for all of our students and classrooms.

Our school has one main fundraiser every fall- the Read-a-Thon. This money goes first to cover our PTO budget. Our budget covers things like: Track and Field, Computer programs (RAZ kids, Study Island, Mystery Science), Birthday books, PTO events (Sun Path Academic Celebration, Anti-bullying, Movie nights, and Staff Appreciation) and classroom donations.

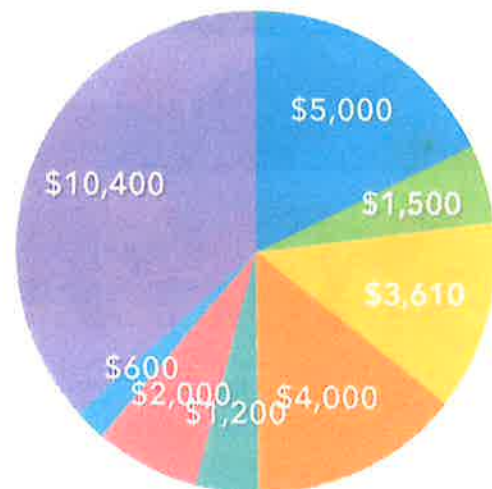
Each year we vote on a fundraising item to be purchased if we raise enough money above and beyond the budget. Some examples of items we have purchased in the past are: a rock climbing wall, heart rate monitors, and smart boards. This year we are hoping to purchase recreation equipment for outdoor education, such as a new feature for the playground, fun games for recess, or a bench or outdoor table for classes to utilize!

We have also been reducing our budget over the past few years due to lack of funds raised- we would love to achieve our goals and be able to increase budget items such as technology/ software for learning and money for classrooms.

What does a typical Read-A-Thon day look like?

Each teacher chooses a theme for their classroom. For example: "Dr. Suess", Eric Carle, Star Wars, or Pop-up-Books. The kids are given a list of themes and choose which rooms they would like to visit in the weeks leading up to the Read-a-Thon. 1st and 2nd grade students stay in the lower floor classrooms and 3rd -5th grade students stay in the upper floor classrooms. We have six 20 minute "reading sessions" - 3 in the morning and 3 in the afternoon. This event is something students look forward to every year. They love visiting other teachers and classrooms! What we love about this type of fundraiser is that it fosters a love of reading!



At the end of the Read- A- Thon event, we will be holding an assembly and we will announce the total raised and the top fundraisers! Kids can earn prizes for raising money at the \$50, \$100 and \$200 (and up) levels! Class prizes will also be awarded!! This year the grand prize winner, who raises the most money overall will win a **Household Membership to the MN Zoo!!**
